In 1990 <u>60 000</u> PNG children had no schooling. Br. Graham Leech, Director of <u>Callan Services</u>, had a plan. Callan Services needed an operational base to support and train others. Children living on the Wewak <u>Dump</u> as well as those with a <u>disability</u> needed support.

Over the years special resources centres have been set up throughout <u>Papua New Guinea</u>. Callan Services' approach is simple: <u>empower</u> and <u>support</u> the local people to help themselves. They are trained to help the people from the <u>villages</u> who do not have the chance of receiving services from the government.

Tertiary students receive nationally recognized <u>qualifications</u>. Successful students who have a <u>disability</u> now want to give to others what they have received themselves.
